After 4 wonderful years as His Majesty's Consul General for the US South West and Hawaii, my term comes to an end in August 2024. It has been an honour to represent the UK in such a dynamic part of the world and work closely with US partners to strengthen the UK-US relationship economically, culturally and diplomatically.

I want to thank the British American Business Council San Diego – its board and members - for wonderful partnership and dedication during this time. It was wonderful that there is now a new San Diego Chapter, and I was delighted to attend your launch event in San Diego earlier this year.

Highlights during my time as Consul General include the UK this year becoming the largest foreign investor in the State of California by number of jobs created; many wonderful visits to San Diego, as well as across the US South West and Hawaii, to progress partnerships; signing Economic Memorandums of Understanding with the City of Los Angeles and State of Utah; championing UK-US partnerships in the creative industries; and laying the groundwork for longer term opportunities like the Olympic and Paralympic Games.

I have been proud to champion and embed the UK's values throughout our work and activities. Wonderful initiatives I have been proud to champion include partnering with Northern Irish Charity Cinemagic to make a film in a California School on tackling climate change; our first Black Founders Trade Mission to California; championing Gender equity through a series of networking events and initiatives, and more.


PARiS 2024

You might say that sport is the glue that binds society together, while food and language provide gateways to culture. Competitive sports can also reflect a nation's status and economic strength.

"Medal power" is one aspect of this, vividly illustrated in the aftermath of the Paris Olympics. Competing nations celebrate both collective and individual achievements through the final medal tally. Smaller nations boast "punching power," where medals per million population highlight impressive accomplishments with limited resources. In contrast, larger nations use their position on the medals table as a testament to their global status.

The world's largest economy, the U.S.A., sits atop the Olympic leaderboard with 126 medals. Across the Atlantic, Great Britain ranks seventh with 65 medals, while holding the position as the sixth-largest economy. (Is Great Britain punching above its weight economically, or underperforming in the Olympics?) Adding to the mix, China ranks second in both medals and economic power, introducing a hint of Cold War rivalry to the competition. Meanwhile, Japan, at third in medals and fourth in the global economy, and France, fifth in medals and seventh economically, showcase how modern Olympic competition is intertwined with the projection of economic strength.

At home, America and Britain share a common passion: football. Historically played on Sundays in industrial towns, football has long been a blue-collar sport in both countries. As both nations' economic stature grew, so did football, reflecting their capitalist nature. Today, it stands as the most-watched sport on either side of the Atlantic. Divided by a common language, Great Britain and the United States are united by football—once a working-class game, now a billion-dollar enterprise. That's a lot of cheddar.
